Welcome to this EVRA Spring Newsletter in which we cover local issues and events. We also warmly welcome to Eaton Village all those residents who have recently moved into the Village.

Draft minutes of the 2022 AGM have been posted on the EVRA website under the About EVRA tab. City Councillor Caroline Ackroyd also attends our Committee meetings as a representative of our local Councillors. Village Sign Refurbishment Project – Our 66 year old Village Sign is currently at a workshop in Hingham being refurbished. The work was delayed because of an accident to the workshop owner but the refurbishment has started and should be completed during March. The City Council will collect the sign and reinstall it on the newly painted post. When we know the return and installation date we will make an announcement on the EVRA website and arrange an official unveiling to welcome the sign home. The sign was presented to the City Council in July 1956 and over the years EVRA has taken the lead on raising funds for its refurbishment including raising £2900 for the current major overhaul and refurbishment.

Speeding around Eaton Village: EVRA continue to monitor vehicle speeds around the Village via the Speed Awareness Monitor (SAM) acquired by our County Councillor. We now have around 18 months of data which highlights that the speeding hot-spot is Church Lane by Eaton Burial Ground where 30% of vehicles exceed 25mph compared to fewer than 20% in other locations. Here, fifty or more vehicles a day exceed 30mph with speeds of 40 and 50mph not uncommon. The sign is moved monthly through a team of volunteers to locations on Sunningdale, Greenways, Church Lane and Judges Walk. Church Lane crossing: EVRA is working with our County Councillor to have a zebra crossing/raised table installed on Church Lane to assist pedestrians crossing near the shops. Proposals were included in the implementation of the 20mph Zone and discussions with County Hall have been going on for some years now but still not resolved. Around 5000 vehicles a day use this section of Church Lane making the road difficult to cross at busy times for our residents.

Friends of Donkey Lane: In 2015 EVRA signed an agreement with the City Council to assist with the maintenance of the banks and verges on Donkey Lane. Since then, Rosemary Benton and her team of volunteers have done a great job planting 1000s of trees and bulbs and keeping the brambles and nettles at bay. They meet most weeks but eight years on the work has become physically too demanding for the team. EVRA wish to continue to manage the lane as part of the green link between the adjacent SSSI site and Marston Marsh. We know that if we stop work on the lane that the City Council will only do the work necessary to maintain safety and all the hard work of our volunteers to create an attractive area will be wasted. Our thoughts are that we establish a new family friendly "Friends of Donkey Lane" group which meets monthly for a few hours on a weekend to keep the banks and verges under control. The tasks would depend on the season but include managing invasive plants, planting new trees and other suitable plants, clearing leaves in Autumn and litter picking. We already have some tools such as loppers and a wheelbarrow we can use. We aim to make this a family friendly and sociable work session so why not join in and bring the family. Village Environment: Several residents have contacted EVRA about the increased amount of dog poo around the Village. Can we politely remind dog owners to pick up and bag their dog poo and deposit this in a waste bin and not throw the bags into a hedge! Problem dog fouling can be reported on the City Council website. We have also received emails about the state of some verges along our roads, particularly where contractor's vehicles have been parked on these during building works. Arranging for the repair and reseeding of these on completion of works would be helpful.
